## **Free Theater Intensive for High School Students**

### **SCENE 1: THEATER INTENSIVE**

This weekly afterschool program for creative teens offers ensemble-based acting training from a distinguished Tony and Drama-Desk Award-winning Off-Broadway theater company. Come join our artistic family, and learn rigorous acting technique in an accessible, cooperative environment.

**SCENE 1** is a **FREE** three-week theater program that provides students with skills-based courses in acting and writing; and the opportunity to participate in a cohesive ensemble of performers.

The program combines **acting training** with **ensemble creation, scene study** and **improvisation**; culminating in a final performance of original student work.

Students will also have master classes with New Group artists such as Tony and Emmy Award Winner **Cynthia Nixon** (*And Just Like That, The Gilded Age*), **Jasmine Cephas Jones** and **Sasha Hutchings** of *Hamilton*, and Oscar nominee **Jesse Eisenberg** (*Zombieland, Batman v Superman*).
